IN THE PIPELINE

City Manager Nina Regor provided the City Council with the first year update on the 2011-2016 Cloverdale Economic Development Plan at the recent City Council meeting. Here are a few highlights: The City started the Opportunity Response Team in 2011 and started tracking new business activity which included meeting with 30 potential new businesses. Of these, 14 new businesses have opened in Cloverdale, bringing 65 new jobs. Seven more businesses are in the works!

The City also received a Community Development Block Grant to develop a business incubator that will include a partnership with CAFÉ (Cloverdale Financial Education) for small business training and counseling.

Our Public Art program has been expanded to include future sculpture acquisitions through participation with the Voigt Foundation.

The City’s tourism website www.genuinelycloverdale.com was launched and is loaded with local lodging, restaurants, and attractions. And the www.cloverdale.com website has been linked with Loopnet a commercial real estate site which enables local realtors to list commercial properties so they can be searched from any computer in the world.



Breakfast for Champions Hears From Calpine

The speakers at the October Breakfast for Champions were Bruce Carlsen, Director of Environmental Health and Safety and Jody Spooner, Manager of Environmental Health and Safety for Calpine. They spoke about the application that Calpine has pending with Sonoma County to build two more power plants at the Geysers well field. They indicated that Calpine has spent a number of years and done several studies to protect native species and archeological sites at the Geysers. They are currently one of the largest producers of steam generated electrical power in the world. The additional plants will be smaller than the existing plants, and generate much needed clean energy for our region. The construction of the plants will be done over a period of two-three years bringing a number of construction jobs to the area. When completed the plants will add an additional 19 fulltime jobs.



Statewide Program Increases Incentives For Home Efficiency

Up To 100% Toward A Home Energy Analysis and Up To \$6,000 Toward Energy Upgrades Available to Sonoma County Residents

SANTA ROSA, Calif. – The Sonoma County Energy Independence Program (SCEIP), and the Regional Climate Protection Authority, in partnership with Energy Upgrade California™ in Sonoma County, have increased local incentives now offering homeowners up to 100-percent rebate for Energy Analysis services. In addition, rebates up to \$6,000 are now available for home energy efficiency upgrades completed through the Whole House Upgrade program.

A Home Energy Analysis uses cutting-edge technology to determine where a home may be leaking energy and wasting money, and will address potential indoor air quality and health concerns. The analyst assesses all the major energy efficiency features of the home, looking at the house as a whole system. Air leaks, heating and cooling systems, water heating systems, insulation, windows, attached lighting fixtures, major appliances, solar systems, and other energy uses are all inspected. The analysis includes a customized evaluation of the home's energy use and identifies specific opportunities to minimize energy waste, and improve comfort, many of which are eligible for further rebates and financing. This is an expansion of the current Energy Analysis rebate offered by SCEIP. Any Sonoma County homeowner may choose to have an analysis performed on their home. Immediate plans for energy efficiency improvements are not required.

Regional incentives have also been added to the existing Energy Upgrade Basic and Advanced pathways to home energy efficiency upgrades as a part of the Energy Upgrade California Whole House Upgrade program. An additional \$1,000 flat-rate rebate brings the total rebate for the Energy Upgrade Basic Package projects to \$2,000. An additional \$2,000 flat-rate rebate for Advanced Package projects means a homeowner can now get up to \$6,000 in rebates. Energy efficiency upgrades in these packages are designed to increase energy and water efficiency, improve indoor air quality, create a more comfortable home, and potentially decrease utility bills.

Both incentive programs are limited-time offers, available on a first-come/first-served basis while funds last. Funding for this program is made available through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). Energy Upgrade California is a statewide program that helps property owners reduce their energy use and save money with rebates, incentives, and financing. To qualify for energy efficiency incentives, homeowners must work with Energy Upgrade Participating Contractors. To qualify for the 100% energy analysis, homeowners must work with a HERS II Rater and receive a Home Energy Score.


