Planning Commission Meeting: The Planning Commission has two important projects on the June 5th agenda. The Commission will conduct design review of a new two-story 1,658 mixed use building located at 119 S. Cloverdale Boulevard behind the "Cloverdale Library" currently occupied by Kelley & Young. In addition, the Commission will conduct a Public hearing to Preliminary Development Plan, Tentative Map and General Plan Amendment for the proposed 33-unit Vista Oaks Project. 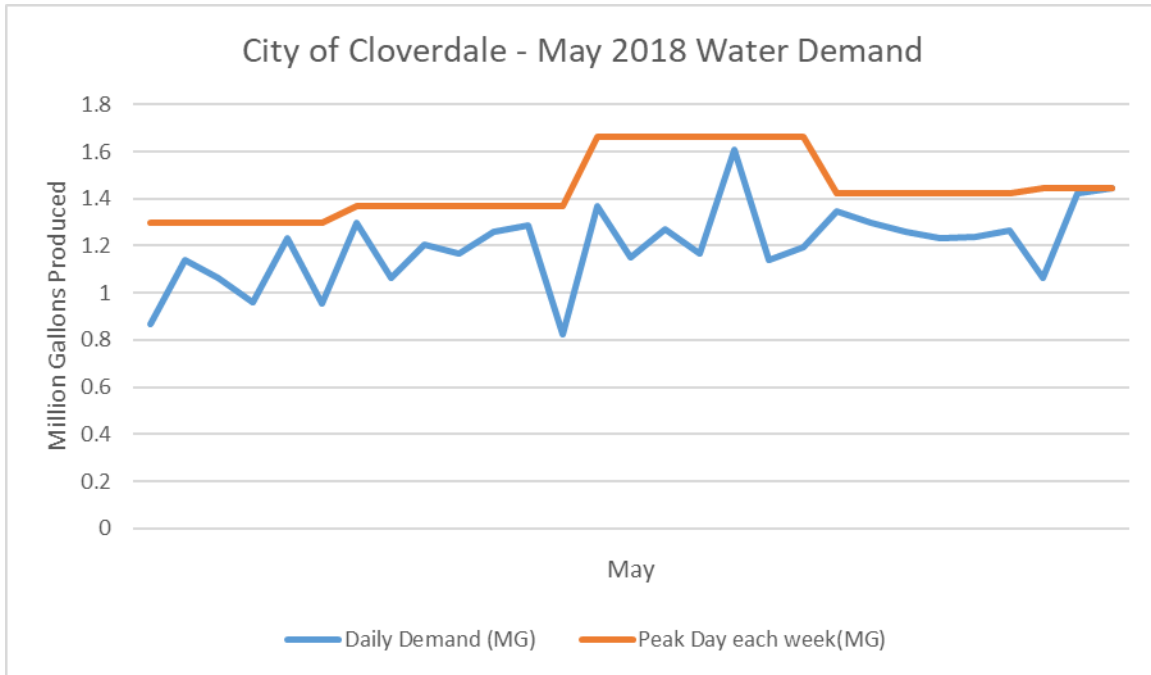

Public Works & Engineering

Water Production: This past week in the Water Department we produced 8.873 million gallons of water. Peak daily production as well as our daily production data for the month of May is identified on the chart below.



Water Quality Consumer Confidence Report: Each year, in early Summer, the City of Cloverdale publishes an analysis of our drinking water quality for the preceding year in a report called the Consumer Confidence Report or CCR. This report ([Link here](#)) shows the results of our water quality monitoring for the period of January 1 - December 31, 2017. In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the U.S. EPA and the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) prescribe regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Cloverdale's CCR identifies the contaminants regulated by the EPA and State Board and documents how well our water did this past year. The Annual 2017 CCR was completed and submitted for approval. The Annual CCR report was approved by the Division of Drinking Water. The CCR is posted on the City's website.
