RESOLUTION NO. 014-2017**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOVERDALE DECLARING THE  
END OF THE WATER SHORTAGE EMERGENCY CONDITION WITHIN THE SERVICE AREA  
OF THE CITY OF CLOVERDALE AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 006-2015 AND ANY  
OTHER RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, THUS ELIMINATING STAGE 1 WATER  
REDUCTION.**

**WHEREAS**, Chapter 13.05 of the municipal code provides for the City to, by resolution, adjust the stage and percent reduction target or end the water supply emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, on January 22, 2014, in response to the driest 14 months ever recorded for the Russian River Watershed, the City declared a Stage 2 Water Shortage Emergency condition and established the overall water reduction amount; and

**WHEREAS**, on February 11, 2015, the City's water supply condition significantly improved with the addition of two supply wells providing an additional 1.0 million gallons a day, the discovery and repair of several major distribution system leaks, and significant customer water conservation. The improved water supply conditions warranted adjusting the City's supply response from a mandatory Stage 2 water reduction stage with a 25 percent reduction target to a Stage 1 voluntary stage with a 20 percent reduction target water use and:

**WHEREAS**, rainfalls during 2016 and 2017 have returned normal storage levels of Lake Mendocino and Lake Sonoma; and

**WHEREAS**, under the current water conditions of the region, a need to reduce water demand by 20 percent cannot be demonstrated.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of the City of Cloverdale, pursuant to Chapter 13.05, of the City's municipal code, does hereby rescinds Resolutions No. 006-2015, and any other resolutions in conflict herewith, thus eliminating Stage 1 conservation of the City's water supply emergency plan and directs staff to continue to actively promote water conservation through educational outreach programs.

**Agenda Item Title**

Consider adopting Resolution 014-2017, ending the water shortage condition Stage 1 conservation of the City's water supply emergency plan pursuant to Chapter 13.05 "Conservation of Water Supply" of the City's municipal code.

Background

Due to previsions drought conditions, on January 22, 2014, the City declared a Stage 2 Water Shortage Emergency condition and established the overall water reduction amount. .

On February 11, 2015, the City's water supply condition significantly improved with the addition of two supply wells providing an additional 1.0 million gallons a day, the discovery and repair of several major distribution system leaks, and significant customer water conservation. The improved water supply conditions warranted adjusting the City's supply response from a mandatory Stage 2 water reduction stage with a 25 percent reduction target to a Stage 1 voluntary stage with a 20 percent reduction target water use.

Current Situation

Since that time, the arrival of significant rainfall has returned storage levels of Lake Mendocino and Lake Sonoma to normal levels, thus continued Level 1 conservation is unwarranted.

City staff will continue to monitor water supply conditions and will recommend appropriate adjustments to its water supply response if conditions change.
