

**City of Cloverdale City Council
Resolution No. 090–2021**

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLOVERDALE APPROVING AN AGREEMENT WITH THE NORTHERN SONOMA FIRE DISTRICT TO IMPLEMENT THE FIRST PHASE OF THE PORTERFIELD CREEK OPEN SPACE VEGETATION MANAGEMENT PROGRAM IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THIRTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$30,000) AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE SAID AGREEMENT IN A FORM APPROVED BY THE CITY ATTORNEY

WHEREAS, the Porterfield Creek Open Space Preserve supports native and non-native plants and contains a build-up of dead, woody fuels and overgrown vegetation that contribute to hazardous fire conditions; and

WHEREAS, selective reduction of hazardous fuel loads through trimming and mulching within the Porterfield Creek Open Space will protect the environment and reduce the amount of hazardous fuels that could contribute to the spread of wildfire to nearby residential neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the City Council allocated funding in the adopted FY 2021-22 City Budget within the Parks Budget totaling \$30,000 for vegetation management activities at the Porterfield Creek Open Space.; and

WHEREAS, the Northern Sonoma County Fuels Crew managed by the Northern Sonoma County (Geyserville) Fire District (“No. So. Co Fire District”) provided a proposal attached hereto as Exhibit “A” that is intended to support and implement the First Phase of the Porterfield Creek Open Space Vegetation Management Program; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager recommends including the Northern Sonoma County (Geyserville) Fire District scope of work attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit “A” in a maintenance agreement, and the No. So. Co Fire District has agreed to execute said professional service agreement; and

WHEREAS, the proposed professional service agreement is for a not to exceed compensation amount of \$30,000, which will be funded by the City’s General Fund and/or grants funds if available.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Cloverdale City Council approves a maintenance agreement with the No. So. Co Fire District to implement the First Phase of the Porterfield Creek Open Space Vegetation Management Program in an amount not to exceed Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) and authorizing the City Manager to execute said agreement in a form approved by the City Attorney.

The foregoing Resolution No. 090-2021 was duly introduced and adopted by the City Council of the City of Cloverdale at its regular meeting held on the 27th day of October 2021 by the following roll call vote:


